Growing Gorgeous Boys into Good Men!

Adolescent boys – they seem to disappear into another world where they barely communicate, and where fast cars, alcohol and drugs are constant temptations. Will they survive to become good men? How can parents and schools understand and help them through this difficult and dangerous time?

Celia Lashlie

After 15 years as the first female prison officer, Celia knows what can happen when boys make the wrong choices. She also knows what it's like to be a parent – she raised a son on her own and feared for his survival. During the recent Good Man Project she talked to 180 classes of boys throughout. The result was a significant insight into the minds of teenage boys and what they are feeling in this period of their lives. There are challenging suggestions for parents if they want to see their sons become the good men they want them to be. Celia is a great speaker and her talk gives parents plenty of food for thought and plenty of hints at how to work with their teenage sons. All parents will find something valuable in this talk -regardless of whether they have sons or not.

Journey to Prison ~ The Role of Our Community

Journey to prison: Who goes and why? What has it got to do with me? What difference can I really make?

Presenter: Celia Lashlie

There is a blond, angelic-faced five-year-old sitting in a classroom and he is coming to prison . . . On his way, he will probably kill someone.' This statement brought **Celia Lashlie** to the attention of the public at large, it also lost her her job. In Journey to Prison Celia Lashlie examines the origins issues of crime in New Zealand, the way we punish offenders, the effectiveness of prison (for both men and women), parental responsibility, the role of drugs, where education comes in and the role of state institutions. **Underpinning her argument is the need for the community as a whole to take responsibility for the incidence of crime in our society.**

Diverting young people away from a Journey to Prison: How effective is

drug and alcohol intervention in keeping young people from prison? What model would work in Illawarra?

Presenter: The Centre for Health Initiatives

Hot off the press research conducted by **The Centre for Health Initiatives** compares a range of drug and alcohol interventions and recommends promising actions for Illawarra Stakeholders and Community in being able to provide a best practise program to assist at risk young people to remain out of prison and supported by their community. This research contrasts national programs and provides a sound **basis to develop future local initiativeswhere to from here?**How can we move forward to take responsibility to reduce the incidence of crime in our society as key stakeholder organisations?
