The Temperature is Rising!!

When making lunches and snacks, please consider what you are using, as lunches do sit in bags for a number of hours before being eaten. If using cold meats, please ensure ice bricks are used and big enough to ensure the sandwich stays cold until eaten at recess or lunch.

Students should also be wearing their school hats during PE, at recess and lunch, and during sport activities. If they are not wearing their school hat, they will be directed to play in the shade.

This week it is anticipated that the mercury will reach 38 degrees late on Friday. If this is the case, all 3-6 sport besides bowling will not go ahead and children will participate in activities at school.


What's in your child's lunchbox?

We have noticed an increase in the amount of packaged foods being packed for student lunches. This increase is not just in snack sizes but also in students consuming 200g bags of chips and boxes of biscuits.

A healthy recess and lunch is important for both brain and body growth and development. Children should be eating at least 3 serves of vegetables and 2 servings of fruit each day. Snacks should be kept to a minimum and be seen as a "treat" and not a staple of each meal.
