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## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

This is the final newsletter for 2020 and what a year it was. As we come closer to the end of the school year, I would like to extend, on behalf of the staff, our thanks to our parent community for

We wish our Year Six students all the very best as they leave behind their primary schooling and transition to high school next year. They have grown so much over this year and we will miss them all very much.

I would also like to take this opportunity to wish Ms Koerner and her family the very best with impending (any day now) birth of her second child.

The last school day for students this year is **Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> December**. Both Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> and Friday 18<sup>th</sup> December are allocated as Staff Development Days; however, staff has attended multiple three-hour Professional learning sessions throughout the year so teachers are able to finish with the students.

Years 1 to 6 return on **Friday 29th January 2021.** Kindergarten students commence **on Tuesday 2nd February.** There will be staggered visits for our Kindergarten students to come to school to complete their Best Start assessments on Friday 29th January and Monday 1st February. Information regarding these sessions has been posted to our new Kindergarten families. Wednesday 27th January and Thursday 28th January are designated Staff Development Days for 2021. Staff will be on site working on the School Improvement Plan (2021 – 2024) and preparing for External Validation. The

school office opens on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> January 2021.

#### STRANGER DANGER

Coming into the holidays, please remind your children about the importance of staying safe when out in public places. It would a timely reminder to discuss what to do when your child feels unsafe.

Here are a few tips from 'keeping your kids safe'.

Protective behaviours encourage children to recognise unsafe situations and to take action through:

- Recognising early warning signs, like butterflies in the stomach, sweaty hands, goose bumps or a racing heart.
- Understanding when to take action. Children need to understand the difference between feeling scared and still having fun, like during a movie; feeling scared but still being in control, like at the dentist; and feeling scared and not being in control, like when they are lost or being harmed by someone. This is a personal emergency and the child needs to seek help.
- **Taking action.** This might mean talking to an adult they can trust, going to a safe place, or even dialling triple zero (000).

#### ROAD SAFFTY

Your primary aged child is still developing an understanding of danger and safety. While they are often keen to do things for themselves, an adult must always be responsible for your child in the traffic environment.

Your child is a vulnerable road user. They are still developing the skills that help them to judge the direction of sound and the speed and distance of vehicles. Your child is physically small, making it harder for drivers to see them. They may be easily distracted and tend to only focus on one thing at a time. This means they find it difficult to deal with sudden changes in the traffic environment.

Your child may be able to tell you the rules and how to keep safe near, in and around vehicles but, in reality, will not always be able to apply them. Take some time to explore and talk about the Safety Town activities with your child. www.safetytown.com.au
