STAFFING UPDATE

SEMESTER ONE REPORTS

Semester One reports will be sent home on Thursday 24th June. Student reports provide parents and carers with clear, comprehensive and consistent information about your child's progress, as well as their next steps in learning. At Lake Illawarra South Public School, we know each child is an individual and we encourage and assist each child to achieve success. These reports will help you to understand the progress your child is making at school.

The A to E reporting system used by teachers does not rank your child is his or her class. rather, the grades indicate whether your child is 'on track' and learning what is expected, doing better than expected or needs additional assistance. The reports use an A-E grade for every subject your child is learning at school. Kindergarten students will also receive a written report but without the A-E grades.

While A-E grades are an important factor of your child's progress at school, they are only part of the picture. Student reports will also include information on your child's level of effort and teacher comments on progress. It must be remembered that throughout their school lives children of approximately the same age will vary greatly in achievement. This occurs because of individual differences in intellectual, physical, emotional and social maturity. Consequently, teachers do not expect all children in their class to attain the same scholastic levels but rather that they work towards the highest standard of which they are capable, achieving their personal best.

TOP BLOKES

A number of Stage Three boys have completed a mentoring program facilitated by the Top Blokes Foundation. The workshops covered a range of social issues that often impact young boys' health. The boys should be congratulated on their positive engagement with the program.

Park & Play is held in the school grounds near the hall each Thursday (8:45am to 10:30am) for parents and their pre-school-aged children aged 0 to 5 years. ATHLETICS CARNIVAL

Our school Athletics Carnival will be held at John O'Dwyer Oval, Albion Park this Wednesday, weather permitting. Event organisers have developed a wet weather plan which involves competitors only attending the carnival. The school will advise the community via SMS if the decision is made to reschedule the carnival to next term or if the carnival proceeds with competitors only.

Students are reminded to wear full uniform or house colours, suitable footwear, hat, sunscreen,

recess, drink and any required medication. It is strongly advised that students also bring a warm coat and something waterproof to sit on if at all possible as the grounds are likely to be wet from the recent rain.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING (PBL)

The focus for this week is Safety – You're your hands and feet to yourself. This skill demonstrates an understanding of personal space. It also encourages students to use their words to express their feelings. This is a life-long social skill that students need to master to form and maintain appropriate relationships.

WONDER RECYCLING REWARDS

Keep sending in bread bags and bread tags. We have sent off our first box of 5kg for recycling and are well on the way with our second box. The program has been extended to the end of the first week of Term Three.



DRIVEWAY SAFETY

On average, more than five children are killed and 47 seriously injured in driveways each year across Australia. In NSW, six children have been killed and fifteen seriously injured in driveway accidents since 2013.

We all have a role when it comes to driveway safety.

Your young child counts on you to supervise them near vehicles, to separate play areas from driveways and see where they are at all times.

Remember to:

Supervise

When your child is around driveways, they should be actively supervised by an adult who is holding their hand. Ensure that young children are placed securely in a vehicle before moving it.

Separate

Treat the driveway like a road. Do not let your child use the driveway as a play area. Separate play spaces from garages and driveways. Home features including fences, high handles on garage doors and self-closing doors or gates can help.

All vehicles have blind spots. Even though reversing sensors and cameras can help reduce blind spots, it can still be hard to see a small child until it is too late. Do not become complacent. Get into the habit of walking around your vehicle before starting it, especially when leaving an area where a young child could be present.


