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#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Term Two is certainly travelling at a fast pace. There are only three weeks until the next vacation period. In that time, we are looking forward to the athletics

carnival, golf lessons for Stage 1 students, peer support and NAIDOC Week celebrations.

Staff has been working over the last few weeks completing assessments and analysing data in preparation for student reports. The report gives detailed information about student progress and the next steps in the learning. Student reports will be sent home in the last week of this term.

Last week I met with the school's Asset Support Officer to discuss further improvements to our school learning environment. A number of items for updating were discussed and suggestions are now being considered by the Department. Some of the plans include new stairs for the Stage 2 building, additional lighting in the stage 3 building, repair and painting of eastern exterior wall of the Stage 2 building and interior painting of the eastern toilet block.

Generate, our chaplaincy provider, has begun the process of securing a new chaplain for the school. Mrs Perceval, Miss Ingram and I will be conducting the interviews, along with a representative from Generate, next week.

I would like to extend the school's profound gratitude to Lake Illawarra High School's principal, Mr Tony Hicks. He is extremely supportive of the primary schools in the Lake Learning Community. He is generous in sharing his staff's expert knowledge with us, encouraging his students to assist with sporting events and his own personal time. To this end, I am very excited to announce that the Lake Learning Community has recently advertised for a Deputy Principal to commence at the beginning of Term Three. This position will be shared across the schools and will involve solidifying the work that has been done over recent years with students transitioning to high school. A large focus of this position will be

collecting and analysing student data to best support students, as well as identifying and delivering professional learning for staff to ensure the best learning outcomes for middle year students in the areas of literacy and numeracy.

You may have noticed that you've not seen our beautiful front crossing lady, Kerrie, in the mornings over the last few weeks. She sadly, informed the school late last week that this Friday afternoon will be her last shift with us as she has secured other work. She has been someone that parents, carers and the school, alike, have relied upon to keep our children safe over the last ten years. I know the students and many parents will miss her cheery 'see ya'. We wish her all the very best in her career change.

#### DJAMALANG

We are very excited to announce that Lake Illawarra South Public School has been selected by the Department of Education to host *Djamalang* – an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Learning and Engagement Centre. The aim of this initiative is to provide wellbeing, academic and cultural support to enhance outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. The program will provide an environment that is culturally appropriate and structured to provide students with opportunities to undertake learning of a cultural nature and also mainstream academic learning.

Jodi Edwards has been appointed as the Djamalang classroom teacher. Jodi, along with school and Department staff are working very closely to develop what the program will look like at Lake Illawarra South. The class will be commencing at the beginning of Term Three.

Our partner high school, Lake Illawarra High, is also hosting a centre and we will be working closely together to support the transition of students into Year 7.

# STRATEGIC DIRECTION 1 – STUDENT GROWTH & ATTAINMENT

Strategic Direction 1 of the School Improvement Plan 2021-2024 aims to maximise student learning

outcomes specifically in Literacy and Numeracy. The growth and attainment of the student outcomes will be measured by the results demonstrated through NAPLAN over the next 4 vears, as well as other internal school data. Within this strategic direction, the teaching staff will be focussing on the explicit teaching in literacy and numeracy. They will do this by clearly explaining to the students why they are learning something, how it connects to what they already know, explaining what they are expected to do, how to do it and what it looks like when they have succeeded. Another component of this strategic direction is utilising and analysing student assessment data that will drive the understanding of where students are in their learning, planning what the students need to do next and making adjustments to the teaching and learning practices that will best support student outcome achievement. This whole school approach will ensure the most effective evidence-based teaching methods support the achievement for all students at Lake Illawarra South Public School.

#### SCHOOL UNIFORM

As we come into the cooler months we ask that students remember to wear their full school uniform - including a school jumper and socks. We also ask that you label your child's uniforms (including jumpers) clearly so that any lost items can be returned to them promptly. Lost property is kept at the front office. # POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING (PBL)

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour across a school and helps schools develop safe and supportive learning environments. Lake Illawarra South Public School has been a PBL school for a number of years. Students benefit from:

- increased time focused on instruction
- improved social-emotional wellbeing
- positive and respectful relationships
- a predictable learning environment

Throughout the year, students are explicitly taught the school expectations through a series of lessons.

The focus for this week is *Responsibility – Be your best*. Encouraging and supporting students to be their personal best helps students to overcome stumbling blocks and develop a growth mindset. A growth mindset allows students to try new things and experiences. It also allows them to push through obstacles (perceived or real) to experience success. Being your best also refers to the way students engage with others, sportsmanship and their behaviour.

The focus for next week is Safety – Keep your hands and feet to yourself. This skill demonstrates an understanding of personal space. It also encourages students to use their words to express their feelings. This skill is a life-long social skill that students need to master to form and maintain appropriate relationships.

## KINDERGARTEN 2022 ENROLMENT

Do you have a child turning five years of age before 31st July 2022 who will be ready to start school next year? We are busy enrolling students from our local intake area for 2022. Please note that all children who do not live in our school catchment area are required to complete a non-local application. Siblings already attending Lake Illawarra South Public School are given priority for enrolment if possible.
