# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

As COVID continues to be a challenge across our state, and with news of a new strain evolving, the Department of Education is continuing their distribution of Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) to families. If you require additional RAT kits, please contact the front office.

Please continue to monitor your child and undertake a RAT, particularly if they exhibit COVID -like symptoms. We continue to have positive cases across our school in both students and staff. This has presented some challenges, as we struggle to replace absent teachers. As you may have seen in the media, casual teachers are in high demand. Occasionally, we have had to combine classes or collapse additional programs when we cannot replace absent staff. This is not a decision we take lightly. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Over the school vacation, energy efficient LED lights will be fitted throughout the school. This work will be completed at no cost to the school.

You may have noticed the change on the school notes letterhead acknowledging that Lake Illawarra South Public School is situated on Dharawal Country. This change came as a result of student requests. The change was put to both staff and the P&C.

Last week, students in Years 4 and 6 completed the NAPLAN Practice sessions. These sessions proved invaluable as there was a technical glitch with the lockdown browser. Many thanks to Miss Olender and the Department tech team who were able to rectify the issue, ready for NAPLAN in Term 2.

Staff from Lake Illawarra South Public School will be participating in a combined half day professional learning session with our colleagues from the Lake Learning Community on the Term 2 School Development Day (Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> April). This week teachers are collaborating in Stage teams to analyse student achievement data and plan for next term's learning sequences. Please be aware that students return for Term 2 on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> April.
