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### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Welcome to Term 2. The school calendar is packed with events and opportunities for students throughout this term such as Peer Support, Stage 3 Camp, Walk Safely to School Day, Family Reading Month, Southern Stars rehearsals, Story Dogs and many sporting opportunities to name but a few. During the vacation period, the basketball court was poured and is currently curing. Painting of the court should take place in the coming weeks. The COLA has also undergone a makeover. ### NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) is an annual collection of information about Australian school students with disability. The NCCD enables schools. education authorities and governments to better understand the needs of students with disability and how they can be best supported at school. #### NSW PUBLIC SCHOOLS SURVEY

Students in Years 3 to 6 are taking part in the NSW Public Schools Student Survey in the coming weeks. The survey is being conducted by the NSW Department of Education and invites students to provide valuable feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways teachers interact with them. The survey will allow the department to conduct analysis and research into student wellbeing and engagement to drive improvement for all NSW public schools.

Breakfast Club is held in the library each morning from 8:10am. There is no cost involved for students participating in Breakfast Club. Our breakfast program is supported by FoodBank Australia and Bakers' Delight.

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#### NUT AWARE SCHOOL

Lake Illawarra South is a Nut Aware School. We would like to remind our community that we have students with severe allergies. To support these students, we ask that families do not send sandwiches with peanut/nut spreads, such as Nutella and peanut butter. Please also do not send loose nuts or nut bars. Thank you for your cooperation.

### ATTENDANCE

When your child is absent, it is important to let the school know the reason why. This can be done via email, a handwritten note or responding to the absence SMS notification. SMS notifications are sent each day from 11am. If you receive a notification, please reply with a specific explanation (e.g. tummy bug, persistent cough, vomiting) that will then be uploaded to our system. Please be aware 'sick' is not a specific explanation. Also be aware that although you provide a reason, the reason may be unjustified. An example of this is staying home to celebrate a child's birthday.

Justified reasons for a student absence (as listed in the NSW Department of Education Attendance policy) are as follows:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an **unavoidable** medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unexplained on the student's record.

The Term 1 data places Lake Illawarra South Public School above the attendance rate for similar schools (SSSG) and the state.

### POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

This week's Positive Behaviour for Learning focus is Safety – Play safely and fairly. Playing fairly helps children enjoy the experience of playing together. It allows children to practise and rehearse social norms of cooperating, taking turns, being polite, solving problems and being flexible. Ensuring children use equipment and school grounds appropriately is vital in keeping everyone safe.

The focus for Week 3 is Responsibility – Be responsible for your learning. This is done through students setting learning goals and working towards achieving them. Students then understand the smaller steps that are needed to achieve larger goals. Students become more aware how their attitude and behaviour impact their learning and progress.

What is the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)?



#### Legislation

- Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (DDA)
- Disability Standards for Education 2005 (the Standards)

Under the legislation, Australian students with disability must be able to access and participate in education on the same basis as their peers.

#### Schools provide reasonable adjustments

Schools provide adjustments to students with disability, in consultation with parents, carers or guardians so students can access and participate in education on the same basis as their peers.

#### Schools provide data for the NCCD

- For the NCCD, schools count, in a consistent manner, the number of students with disability receiving adjustments to access and participate in education.
- School teams make professional judgements on eligible students based on the levels of adjustments provided, the categories of disability and the evidence to support the decisions made.
- This information is provided to education authorities and includes the year of schooling, the category of disability and level of adjustment provided.

No identifying information or personal details are provided to the Australian Government in the NCCD.



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#### NCCD data is used

- As an evidence base, to give teachers, schools and sectors information about students with disability and the level of educational adjustment being provided
- To inform policy development and future planning to better equip schools and education authorities to support students with disability
- To improve understanding of the requirements and responsibilities of school teams and the broader community under the DDA and the Standards
- To capture the work of schools under the obligations of the DDA and the Standards, allowing students with disability to access and participate in education on the same basis as other students
- To highlight the individual needs of each student with disability by focusing on the level of educational support provided to them at school
