We have a busy few weeks ahead of us at Lake South! Year 6 students began their transition to high school activities with a visit from their LIHS 2026 Year Advisor this morning. Classes are busy preparing for the Premier's Spelling Bee class competitions that will take place throughout this week. Southern Stars preparation has commenced with both our dance group and Yanggaa Garaba students attending rehearsals. Stage 2 and 3 students begin their Interrelate human growth and development lessons this week. Finally, our school athletics carnival will be held next Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> June.

I was fortunate to join Year 1 in K/1A last week to see the wonderful learning that happens in their spelling lessons. It was wonderful to see every student engaged and successful in their learning.



Work has finally concluded on our main COLA area with new line marking painted last week. Students now have access to hand ball squares and two pickle ball courts. #### HAWKS CLINIC

Stage 3 students were fortunate to participate in a basketball clinic run by the Illawarra Hawks during Week 6. Students perfected their dribbling, passing and footwork skills while participating in a range of activities and games.





#### PREMIER'S SPELLING BEE

The Premier's Spelling Bee is an annual state-based event where students compete to spell a broad selection of words. Participants must spell increasingly challenging words aloud in front of a judge. The event tests students' skill, concentration and resilience.

All students in Year 3-6 will participate in a class Spelling Bee throughout this week. The strongest spellers from each class will then participate in a stage spelling bee in the school hall on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> June. Stage finalists will represent Lake South at the regional finals later this term.

#### DEBATING

Our debate team had their first competition against Windang Public School last Monday. Students were asked to present the affirmative arguments for the topic: every class in primary school should adopt a dog or a cat as a class pet. While the team did not come away with a win on the day they demonstrated excellent understanding of the debate structure, identified some solid arguments and showed incredible poise and resilience.

There's no rest for this team! Only four days after their first ever debate, the team travelled to Balarana Public School for two debates. In the first debate, against Balarang Public School, they presented the negative argument for the topic: schools should give every Year 6 student a turn in leadership instead of appointing a few kids for the whole year. The second debate, against Mt Terry Public School, required the team to present the negative argument once again, this time for the topic: primary schools should have a video games room which students can use in their breaks or when they finish their work early. Both debates were successfully won by our Lake South team who made Mrs McCurry proud by implementing the valuable feedback they received from the adjudicator in their first debate. Well done!



#### KISS AND DROP ZONE

Please ensure you are adhering to the parking signs when dropping off and collecting students. The Kiss and Drop Zone is located on Reddall Parade and is designed for quick entry and exit. The zone minimises congestion and risk when used properly by all parents and carers. The zone operates under the same conditions as no parking zones which means you may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of two minutes. The driver is required to remain in, or within 3 metres of, their vehicle. The zone operates as a Kiss and Drop zone 8:00 – 9:30 and 2:30 – 4:00pm. It is parking at all other times.

Several vehicles have also been performing U-turns over double-white lines within the school zone. Please use the roundabout at Stanley Street to perform U-turns for the safety of our students.

#### NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) is an annual collection of information about Australian school students with disability. The NCCD enables schools. Education authorities and governments to better understand the needs of students with disability and how they can be best supported at school. Congratulations to the 108 students who had 100% attendance during the past fortnight. We're very proud of you.

This is the attendance data for the last fortnight broken down into year groups:

Kinder: 91% Year 1: 92% Year 2: 90% Year 3: 90% Year 4: 92% Year 5: 87% Year 6: 88%

NSW public schools have an attendance target of 95%. Missing just one day of school each fortnight adds up to four weeks of lost learning a year. Over a student's school life, this equates to an entire year of missed learning.

### POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

This week's Positive Behaviour for Learning focus is Responsibility – Be Your Best. Being Your Best encourages students to take ownership of their actions, both in the classroom and the playground. By promoting a sense of accountability, we inspire children to set personal goals, complete tasks with care and support their peers.

In Week 9 and 10, our Positive behaviour for Learning focus on Safety – Keep your hands and feet to yourself. Clear expectations such as keep your hands and feet to yourself support children in developing their understanding of personal space. An important part of this skill is to support students in using their voice to express their thoughts and emotions, particularly when they are upset.

## KINDERGARTEN 2026

Enrolments for Kindergarten 2026 are now being accepted. Applications for siblings of currently enrolled students can be submitted for consideration by the non-local enrolment panel. If you are a local enrolment, you are able to enrol online or call to the school office and collect an Enrolment Pack.

To enrol online, go to the school website https://lakeillaws-p.schools.nsw.gov.au/; Click on Enrolment at the top of the page Click on Apply for enrolment online

Read the information and then go to the bottom of the page and *Enrolling for 2026 calendar year* 

Type in your residential address; if your address is in the school's local area you will be able to click on the Apply to Enrol button. This takes you to the Privacy Agreement.

Click *I agree* to the Privacy Agreement and continue

Add your email address and tick *I'm not a robot* and click *continue*; you will be sent a verification code to your email address.

Enter the code and click verify and proceed to the Enrolment Form.

If you are applying to enrol a sibling of a current 'out of area' student, you will need to call the school office to register your child and collect the required enrolment form for completion. If you do not live within the Lake Illawarra South Public School catchment area, you are welcome to submit a non-local enrolment application for consideration by our non-local enrolment panel.
